Since 1990, more than one hundred mayors in France have been awarded a 'golden sash' for their outstanding initiatives to improve road safety. 'Les Echarpes d'Or de la Prévention Routière' aims at rewarding local communities for remarkable actions taken in the field of infrastructure, education, awareness raising or compliance with traffic safety law. Each year, a jury evaluates the candidates' application and selects the best actions taken the year before.
