EU Member States have pledged to cut annual road deaths by half by the year 2010. But are policy makers taking the necessary steps to substantially improve their road safety records? Are they implementing effective strategies targeting speeding, drink driving and non use of seat belt and helmet? Are they improving their road infrastructure network?

ETSC, together with the Swedish Road Administration and Toyota Motor Europe, is establishing a monitoring mechanism to pin those responsible down to ensure they deliver on their commitment. The Road Safety Performance Index (so-called "Road Safety PIN") will compare EU Member States' performance in promoting safe road user behaviour, infrastructure and vehicles, as well as sound and evidence-based policymaking, on the basis of performance indicators.

The aim is to assess and communicate the failures and successes of national road safety policies in Europe. Tracking Member States' efforts will help to identify best practice in the key road safety policy areas and bring about the kind of political leadership that is needed to create what citizens deserve – a road transport system that offers a maximum of safety.
