**First Road Safety PIN Talk to be held in Greece**

The European Transport Safety Council (ETSC)<sup>(1)</sup> and its Greek member, the Road Safety Institute Panos Mylonas (RSI Panos Mylonas)<sup>(2)</sup> are organising the first Road Safety PIN Talk in Athens on the 15<sup>th</sup> of November 2006. Decision makers, distinguished speakers and experts have been invited to this dialogue on how to improve road user behaviour in Greece.

Speakers include amongst others Minister **Michalis Liapis**, Minister **Vyron Polydoros**, MP **Aris Stathakis**, MP **Yannis Maniatis**, **Christos Ntzoufras**, Director of Traffic Police, **Nikos Papaefstathiou**, President of EKAB, **George Skourtis**, President of the Union of Insurance Companies, **Vassilis Despotopoulos**, President of ELPA (Automobile and Touring Club), Prof. **George Kanellaidis** and Ass. Prof. **George Yannis** from National Technical University of Athens, Prof. **Aristotelis Naniopoulos**, Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, **Ioannis Frantsekakis**, Senior Transport Engineer, and **Ioannis Handanos**, President of the Hellenic Institute of Transportation Engineers.

A first ranking published recently under the Road Safety Performance Index (PIN)<sup>(3)</sup> shows that fast progress in road safety is possible for every country, whatever its starting point. Over the last four years, France has achieved an outstanding 35% drop, closely followed by Luxembourg with 34% and Belgium with 27%. According to ETSC findings, Greece has a very low level of safety, ranking third worst country among the EU-25 in terms of road deaths per million of inhabitants<sup>(4)</sup>. The country has however started to learn from other countries' experiences and was able to reduce road deaths by 14% between 2001 and 2005<sup>(5)</sup>.

The discussion of the 15 November 2006 will focus on the achievements and weaknesses of Greek road safety policy against the background of other European countries, the use of road safety performance indicators and the measures that need to be taken to improve road user behaviour in the area of speeding, drink driving and non use of safety restraints.

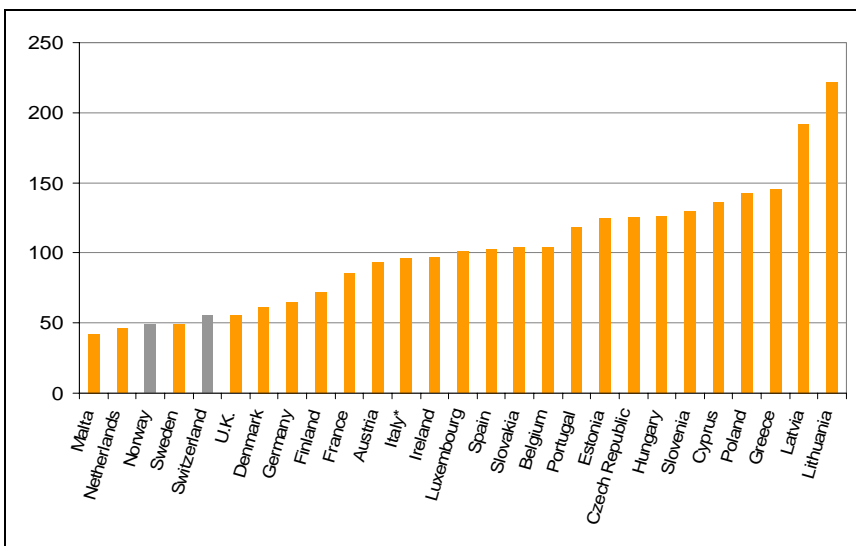
**Notes to Editors:**
